60th Anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights

Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, President of the Human Rights Commission in its first years, asked:

“Where, after all, do universal human rights begin? In small places, close to home - so close and so small that they cannot be seen on any maps of the world...”

Human Rights are the legal and written recognition of the dignity and equality of all persons. They are inalienable, indivisible, and universal. They are those basic rights that belong to all people because they are human beings, regardless of their nationality, race, ethnicity, gender or religion, and without which people cannot live in dignity.
