Because only three-quarters of all countries have laws on domestic violence to-date, "... yet 137 women across the world are killed by a member of their own family every day; unpaid care and domestic work are largely shouldered by women everywhere, often at the cost of their career growth and economic participation. While poverty has declined, it remains highly feminized: women aged 25-34 are 25% more likely than men the same age to live in extreme poverty..." (UN Women)
